From homelessness, drugs and ungodly relationships, to a life in Christ – that's where God has brought me.

I was homeless in 2000 with my five year old son, Joseph, and ended up coming to Lifespring Ministry. This is where my journey with Jesus began and in 2001 I turned my life over to him. The biggest thing that Lifespring taught me: that being a Christian is all about a personal relationship with God through Jesus. I got into a Bible believing church where I serve to this day.

So much has happened these past 13 years. My son is 17 now, I was married in 2003, and I now have two daughters. God has allowed my husband and me the privilege to help other women who struggle with the same things I struggled with in my past. I found out that in helping others, God helps you! We've been volunteering at Lifespring in any way we can by babysitting, providing transportation to those needing to get to work, doing auto repairs for some of the residents and even taking families into our home



temporarily until they could get into Lifespring. Often I have the chance to talk with the women currently in the program and former residents of Lifespring and encourage them to stay true to God's Word. We are to lift up and be builders of one another; this is what my mentor instilled in me.

II Cor 5:18 says, "And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given us the ministry of reconciliation."

That's what Lifespring means to me, bringing you back to life in Christ.

od called me to serve at Lifespring in early 2008, and it has been one of the greatest gifts I have known. Looking back on the whole of my life, I can see how God has always been preparing me for a time such as this.

Though I started in the Adopt-a-Friend Program and organized projects for Lifespring, it did not take long for me to hear God whisper that more should be offered. So, I wrote and started leading a study on perseverance two afternoons each month and started leading a Self-Esteem Bible Study two evenings a month in 2010. At that time I also started doing Phase Three's One-on-One Bible Study when the opportunity presented itself. Now almost three years have passed in which I have served in this manner, and my life knows a beauty and my journey a fruitfulness that can only be of God.



My increased time at Lifespring allows me to meet ladies as soon as they arrive and begin to encourage and pray for them. Knowing these ladies and their children is a privilege. Whatever gifts I have to offer by God's grace and provision is nothing compared to how they have blessed me in return. The opportunities to share how God works in our lives (both in times of peace or strife) as we walk through His word allows the ladies and me to experience mutual encouragement as proof that none of us are alone.

I have said before that I have learned to embrace the blissful ambiguity of the unknown concerning what better things God would have me do, and then embrace them as my own. I continue to remember to give thanks for the time, talent and treasure God provides by endeavoring to joyfully pour them out into Lifespring, as well as other areas of my life. This has become a truth of great value at my place of employment. At my last annual review in January, my supervisor and one of the owners noted how God allows my volunteer work to benefit me, which flows over into my professional work. I was told that it is a good and fruitful thing that



should be allowed to continue. Having said all this, "God is good" truly becomes an understatement.

If how God has worked in me can encourage anyone who feels the slightest call to serve at Wayside Cross Ministries, I urge you to start today. God's word is the ultimate encouragement. I offer you the following three passages of scripture that have been foundational to my service for more than a decade: John 3:16 (from where I draw nourishment for my faith); 1 John 4:4 (the means by which I persevere); 1 John 4:19 (the reason I serve at Lifespring and at work).


