This summer held several changes compared with our summer camps in the past. These included a change in the time, location, and participants of the camp. Camp was held at St.



Olaf Lutheran Church instead of Brady Elementary School. The change in location was incredibly difficult for me at first. My leadership at Brady has spanned the past three years and I felt the Lord was blessing our efforts there.

Because of a scheduling conflict with a secular summer camp, we had the option to eliminate our Christ-focused activities or hold the camp elsewhere. I didn't understand why God would have us change

Because our location differed this summer, the 60 kids that we served differed as well. We transported approximately 30 children from the area around Brady, the rest came from the South Wind and Harbor Village housing complexes near the church. challenging. Several times in the first week I called out to God, unsure of His purpose for the camp. As summer progressed, His faithfulness shined through.

He continued to show His grace and mercy despite the unique circumstances. After weeks of crafts, academics, games, and Bible stories the Lord once again showed me the beauty of His purposes and sovereignty over all. Change isn't always easy or desirable, but I believe that when God takes His children out of their comfort zones and into complete reliance on Him, He works in ways we never thought possible!
